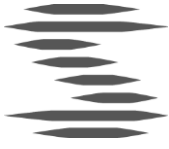

Information on the procession of personal data and the Personal Data Officer

Any personal data, which the report may contain, will be treated in the following manner. It is important that you understand how it works.

1. **Personal data responsible:** Svenska kraftnät is responsible for personal data in the whistle-blower system. Address: Sturegatan 1, Sundbyberg. For questions, contact Svenska kraftnät's Personal Data Officer. Phone number: +46 10-475 80 05
2. **Purpose of the processing:** Personal data is used to examine the reports submitted, and to investigate if the persons indicated have been involved in criminal acts such as corruption or other serious irregularities.
3. **Information being processed:** The personal data that we process, is the information submitted in the report and additional information that may be collected in order to conduct an effective investigation. Data may, among other things, include name, position and information about the suspected offence.
4. **Recipients of the data:** Svenska kraftnät has limited the permission to access the information in the report function, so that only a specific internal organisation has access to this information for the purpose of processing reports and conducting investigations, and only if the information is required to perform their work.
5. **Right to register abstracts, etcetera.:** Under section 26 of the Personal Data Act, you have the right to receive information about the personal data that we process about you, free of charge, and once per calendar year. If you wish to receive such information, please send a written request to Svenska kraftnät. If your personal data is handled in breach of the personal data Act, you can, according to section 28 of the Act, request that the personal data is corrected, blocked or deleted.
6. **Principle of public access:** Since Svenska kraftnät is a Swedish Authority, a report submitted to Svenska kraftnät is a public document. Data



may therefore be disclosed in accordance with the principle of public access.
